ABOUT SHARED CARE



The Hull Primary Care Addictions Service supports you and your family by providing long-term recovery to improve health and wellbeing and reduce the incidence of chronic health conditions associated with drug and alcohol use.

Your care will be managed by a dedicated Hull Primary Care Addictions team member, and the prescribing needs met by the medical practices' General Practitioner/ Independent Prescriber. You will have one to one appointments with your worker and supported with not only your recovery but wellbeing, social and physical support. Care plans will be agreed with you and a plan put in place on how best we can support you.

Reviews will be held with your support worker and the GP/Prescriber, During these appointments any other medical concerns can be discussed with your Prescriber.

MYTHS & REALITIES

START HERE

Myth 1

Some people believe that they will be forced into detox / rehab or reducing their current script

Reality 1

It's your recovery journey. We can advise & support but there is no pressure to reduce or go through detox, You set your own plan

Myth 2

That the GP and/or support worker are not qualified or have the knowledge in substance misuse

Reality 2

The GP and staff are qualified and experienced in substance misuse, we also have peer mentors to offer support

Reality 3

We like to see our patients every 4-6 weeks face to face, However if you need or want more regular appointments then we can do that, We will also keep in contact via phone calls/texts

Myth 3

That you'll have to attend more frequent appointments with your worker or with your GP
