## CONTROLS/PRECAUTIONS (list)

A Colour Festival Safety Protocol is to be implemented, to include:

**Designated area:**

- Colour festival is only to occur in the designated area
- The designated area is;
  - Open air
  - A large outdoor space clearly marked. The designated area is part of a much larger outdoor space allowing participants to quickly leave the affected area if necessary
- There are no open flames or high heat sources in the designated area.
- Event marshals are present at all times

**Colour Powder:**

- Only the colour powder provided by the event organisers can be used
- Colour powder is non-toxic, [comprised only of corn starch, baking soda, and FD&C or D&C grade dyes]
- Coshh data sheets are to be obtained, reviewed and found acceptable
- Colour powder is only issued to participants in small bags never in bulk
- Only hand thrown powder can be used
- Only authorised and trained personnel can use colour powder extinguishers
- Empty bags are to be placed in bins provided

**Safety Guidelines:**

- On registration all participants agree to the liability waiver
- Powder can only be thrown in the designated area.
- Participants are required not to smoke in the designated area during the colour festival
- Powder must not be thrown toward people's face
- SDS sheets for the colour powder are on-site to provide to first responders in case of an emergency

**Recommendations for Participants:**

- Protect feet with closed toe shoes
- Protect eyes with sunglasses or goggles
- Protect mouth with a bandana or dust mask
- Protect electronics in plastic bags or plastic wrap


**Removing the powder**


- Flush with water to remove powder from eyes, mouth or nose; mild soap and water recommended for cleaning on skin.
